



Vehicle Disaster Supplies Kit

Quick Reference Card

Do you have a plan? You may need to survive on your own after a disaster. This means having food, water, and other supplies in sufficient quantity to last for at least three days. Local officials and relief workers will be on the scene after a disaster, but they cannot reach everyone immediately. FEMA recommends putting together a “Disaster Supplies Kit,” a collection of basic items that members of your household may need in the event of a disaster. Keep the items that you would most likely need during an evacuation in an easy-to-carry container. Possible containers include a camping backpack, duffle bag or small suitcase that can easily fit in your trunk.

For each vehicle you drive, FEMA says you should keep a disaster kit of emergency supplies in the vehicle, to include:

FIRST-AID KIT

- Extra medication
- Debris mask
- Scissors

SPECIALTY ITEMS

- Baby wipes/
Toilet paper
- Whistle
- Insurance card

- Important phone
numbers

CLOTHING (Seasonal)

- Blanket
- Jacket
- Comfortable
walking shoes
- Hat (summer)
- Beanie (winter)
- Gloves
- Extra socks

FOOD

- Canned food and
juice with opener
- Plastic utensils
and cups

TOOLS

- Batteries
- Duct tape
- Flashlight
- Radio
- Multi-tool
- Tarp
- Rope
- Permanent marker
- Spray paint
- Flares
